

LOCATION

An hour away from London by train, Leicester is a multicultural and welcoming city. Its central location means it has excellent travel links with all parts of the UK. Leicester has been named as the 16th best city in the UK* in which to live and work, ahead of London, Brighton and our Midlands neighbours Birmingham, Nottingham and Derby.

The cost of living is lower than London, with low-cost student accommodation near to campus and university halls of residence starting from less than £100 per week, including bills.



ACCOMMODATION

DMU has 10 halls of residence for international students, all of which are either on or within 10 minutes' walk of the campus. There is a choice of mixed or same-gender flats available. Flats are mostly en suite and self-catered, with shared kitchens and laundry facilities on site.

You can also choose private accommodation options. Whether you want to live independently in Leicester or stay on campus, there is something to suit everyone.
